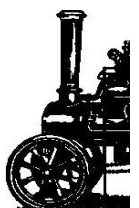

# PRESS RELEASE:

The Trustees of the Woodcote Charitable Association are very pleased to announce that following the 2010 Woodcote Rally (which was held over the weekend of 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> July) the surplus generated by the Rally this year was a massive £20,000!

This means that this year we have almost 75% more money than in 2009 to give away to around 50 local charities and worthy good causes that the Woodcote Rally supports each year. The weather was very kind to us this year which meant attendance numbers were up on last year but the main reason for the increase in the surplus was due to the excellent efforts of the Rally Committee who managed to stage the Rally at a reduced cost from previous years and well within their set budget for 2010 – Well done to the Rally Committee!

Next year's Rally (our 48<sup>th</sup>) will be held over the weekend of 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> July 2011 and we hope that we can at least match this year's achievement.

Our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary is coming up in 2013 and we are already planning a really spectacular event to mark this occasion so look out for future announcements.
